The Baptism of our Lord — is celebrated on Sunday Jan. 12. The Christmas season comes to an end and Ordinary Time begins. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation which occurred on His baptism. Jesus descended into the river to sanctify its waters and give them power to beget sons of God. The event takes on importance of a second creation where the entire Trinity intervenes. This feast is called *Theophany* because at the baptism of Christ in the River Jordan God appeared in three persons. The baptism of John was sacramental preparatory for the Baptism of Christ. It moved men to sentiments of repentance. Christ did not need the baptism of John. Although He appeared in "substance of our flesh" and recognized "outwardly like unto ourselves", He was absolutely sinless and impeccable. He conferred upon the water power of the true Baptism which would remove all the sins of the world: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him Who takes away the sin of the world". At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become adopted sons of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we pray to avoid sin. (catholicculture.org)

On Monday, December 23rd the St. Rose Science club spent the morning at Dig World in Katy. Dig world is a theme park that allows kids to operate bull dozers, skid steers, excavators and lots of other heavy equipment The group was small because of the holidays but nonetheless lively.

Upon arrival a large group of science club members rode the lift – which rose above the Katy Mills mall and allowed a panoramic view of the Katy area. At the top kids were challenged to throw a tennis ball in a bucket on the ground. The club had a few kids who successfully dropped their ball into the bucket only to have their efforts squashed when the ball bounced nearly 30 feet back in the air. Newton once

After a ride on the lift, science club members scattered to many different attractions. Some students spent the morning digging up sand with an excavator while others were challenged to pick up magnetic objects such as giant rubber ducks and heavy weights.
