**Report Cards** – Sent out Wed. Finish strong, read daily, do homework, study for tests.

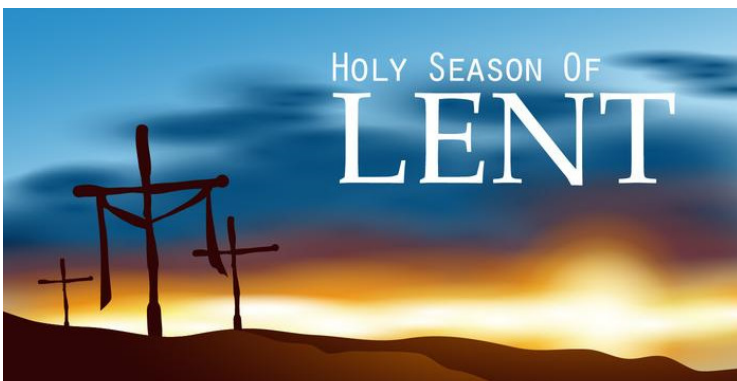
**HSA** – Thank you for \$35,000 annual subsidy. This helps keep fees and rates affordable.

**Saint Joseph** – The feast of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary was March 19. The Bible states Joseph was a "just" man. It means that God, the all-holy one, so transforms a person that they share somehow in God's own holiness, and hence it is really "right" for God to love him or her. The Bible means he was one who was completely open to all God wanted to do for him. He became holy by opening himself totally to God. Think of the kind of love with which he wooed and won Mary, and the depth of the love they shared during their marriage. It is no contradiction of Joseph's manly holiness he decided to divorce Mary when she was found to be with child. The important words of the Bible are he planned to do this "quietly" because he was "a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame". The just man was simply, joyfully, wholeheartedly obedient to God—in marrying Mary, in naming Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth, in the undetermined number of years of quiet faith and courage. 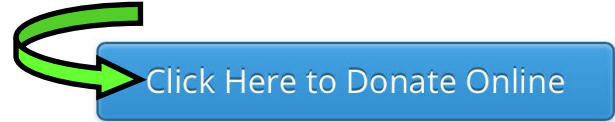

Founded in 1889 and grounded in Catholicism, St. Rose School has a rich history of providing authentic, relevant education while shaping well-rounded students who positively impact the community.

Our 13-month renovation project begins in Spring 2025, with Phase I requiring approximately \$3 million. This phase will focus on the elementary and office areas, and install a walkway canopy.

Phase II will update the junior high wing.

Phase III will expand the music room and enclose the walkway between the elementary and junior high buildings for safety measures.

## **2025-2026 Open Enrollment**

### **Early Registration is March 17-28**

Registration for new students in grades 4K-8 may be completed at the school office during the hours of 8:00 am-3:00 pm.

Parents of new students must present birth certificate, baptism certificate (if applicable), Social Security card and their child's immunization records at the time of registration.

A student is eligible for admission into 4K if he/she has reached the age of 4 on or before September 1. A child is eligible for admission into Kindergarten if he/she has reached the age of 5 on or before September 1. A child is eligible for admission into first grade if he/she has reached the age of six years on or before September 1.

St. Rose of Lima Catholic School is recognized by the Texas Education Agency as a fully accredited school. St. Rose of Lima Catholic School is also accredited by the Texas Catholic Conference Accreditation Commission.
